

(Left) WHS Wayshak Fab Lab - Our K-12 education innovation specialist, Beth Lloyd, facilitated a Fab Lab orientation with visiting Medway Schools personnel who toured the space and heard about creative uses from some WHS students/teachers. Our aim is to document student work including reflections, process, and product as teachers continue integrating it into the curriculum.

(Left Top) Hosmer School - A visit to Kelly Graves' fourth-grade co-taught classroom with special educator, Sarah Pelletier, revealed modeling of a solid math lesson. Using a formative assessment to check for understanding, students solved math problems on individual mini-whiteboards while Ms. Graves most effectively led whole-group instruction. Student engagement was consistent, and with Ms. Pelletier seated among her students, she was able to monitor their progress during the lesson and make modifications where needed.

(Left Bottom) Down the hall, Mike Murphy was teaching his English language learners while Melissa Reohr, a new ESL teacher, conducted a peer observation. The excellent lesson included both language and content objectives positioned prominently in the classroom and referred to with frequency to assist students in honing their learning.

Some DESE Updates:

PISA Results Put Massachusetts among Top Nations: The 2015 results from the Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) show that if Massachusetts were a nation, it would share the top spot in reading with eight other nations worldwide. In science, the state's students and those from 10 nations came in second, trailing only students from Singapore. In math, 11 other nations were ahead of the Commonwealth. The triennial test, which assesses a sample of 15-year-olds, also showed that high-poverty schools in Massachusetts had higher scores in 2015 than in 2012.

Resources for Science and Technology/Engineering MCAS:

We have identified the 2001/06 grades 3–5 and grades 6-8 science and technology/engineering (STE) standards that will be assessed on the 2017 MCAS grades 5 and 8 STE test. These lists will assist schools currently transitioning to the standards in the 2016 Massachusetts STE Framework.
